

# DOOR OPENING OPTIONS

For individuals experiencing difficulty operating a standard door or key lock there are alternative keys available to complete door locking or unlocking.

Type	Description	Type	Description
<b>Finger Print Lock</b> 	<p>These are designed to control access through fingerprint scanning. These locks have a capacity for a number of finger prints.</p>	<b>RFID Tag or Card Lock</b> 	<p>These allow access by holding an RFID tag or card to a door lock which then allows the door to open.</p>
<b>Password Lock</b> 	<p>Password locks enable a key code to be entered by the user to enable access.</p>	<b>Smart Phone Lock</b> 	<p>These locks are Bluetooth enabled and allow you to unlock your door wirelessly using an App. An eKey can be sent to a visitor if they need to enter the door. The app can store history of lock activity.</p>
<b>Automatic Opening Doors</b> 	<p>Automatically opening and closing doors are available. These are most commonly encountered as entry doors to public buildings but may suit residential applications.</p>	<b>Key Turners</b> 	<p>A variety of key turners can be added to the key to provide a stable extension so that the key can be manipulated into the lock and then provide leverage for turning of the key.</p>
<b>Alternate Door Knob Options (Lever)</b> 	<p>Door knobs can be replaced on doors. These can come in a variety of shapes and sizes which may allow independent operation of the door.</p>	<b>Door Knob Converters</b> 	<p>Door knob converters can be added to assist leverage of a standard door handle. These can come with a loop attached to further assist the individual.</p>

# DOORBELL OPTIONS

For individuals experiencing difficulty operating a standard doorbell there are alternative options available.

Type	Function
<p><b>Vibrating Doorbell</b></p> 	<p>Alerts users of doorbell activation by vibrating. This may be useful for people with hearing impairments.</p>
<p><b>Flashing Doorbell</b></p> 	<p>Alerts home owners of doorbell activation by one or multiple flashing lights positioned around the home. This may be useful for people with hearing impairments.</p>
<p><b>Phone Line Connected Doorbell</b></p> 	<p>Doorbells can be connected to your phone line so that when the doorbell is pressed the phone will ring. This option can be useful for a person who has a slight hearing impairment but is still able to hear their phone ring.</p>
<p><b>Smart Doorbell</b></p> 	<p>Smart Doorbells are in development. They can alert you on your smart phone or tablet when your doorbell is pressed. You can see and talk with the person at your front door or their visit can be recorded and a reminder sent to your device.</p>
